The Fallen Rider Memorial Run (FRMR) was started in 1998 as an impromptu remembrance ride to honor the memory of RON AND LOUISE KAGAN, a loss felt by many in the community. Over 120 riders gathered for the run with less than two weeks' notice. The first official annual run took place in 1999 with 188 riders and continues to grow each year. A lot of work goes into making a ride happen. The volunteers for this ride are members of several motorcycle groups in the Northern California area. These include Redding Harley Owners Group, Redding Yamaha, Lee's Honda and STAR Touring and Riding, all working together with common interests in mind, to honor our fallen riders, to bring awareness to the community of motorcyclists on the road and to donate to charitable causes.
